Mark Shaya, M.D.

The stroke team includes emergency department physicians, neurologists, neurosurgeons, interventional radiologists and radiologists who specialize in the care of strokes. Dr. Shaya performs a wide range of neurosurgical procedures at North Shore Medical Center and has published extensively on spinal disease and brain tumors. Dr. Shaya has also developed a grading system for hypertensive intracerebral hemorrhage and authored a neurosurgery review textbook that is used extensively by the neurosurgical community.

Dr. Shaya is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and participates in many leadership opportunities at North Shore Medical Center. He is an active member of the Bylaws Committee and Credentials Committee at the hospital. He earned his M.D. at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, completed his general surgery internship at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas, and obtained his neurological surgery residency and spine fellowship from Louisiana State University.
